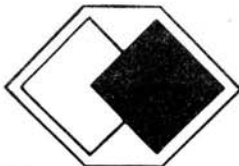

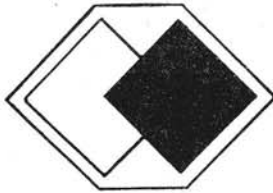

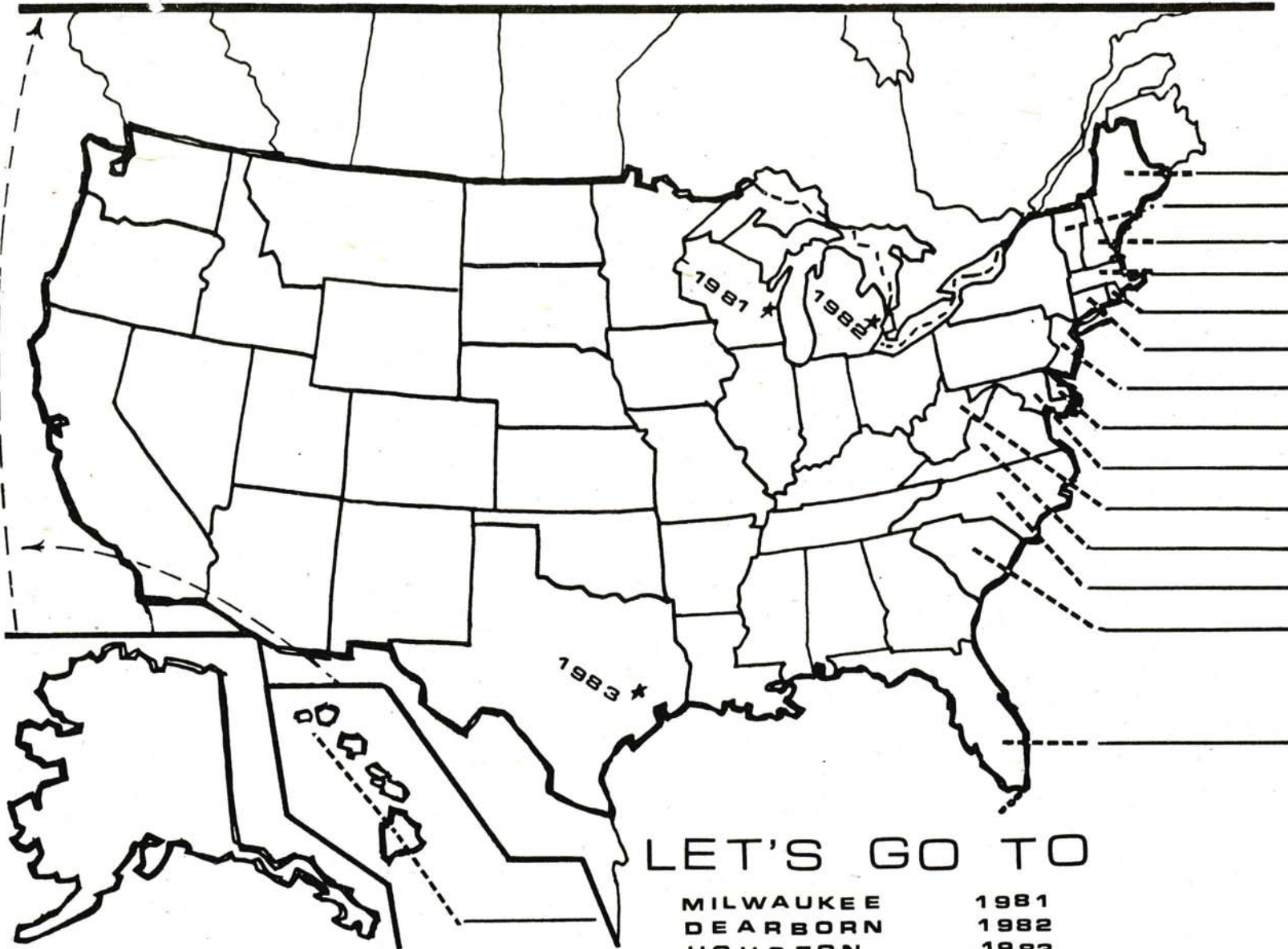

In Memorium....

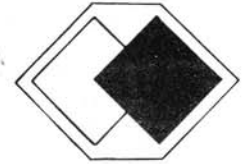

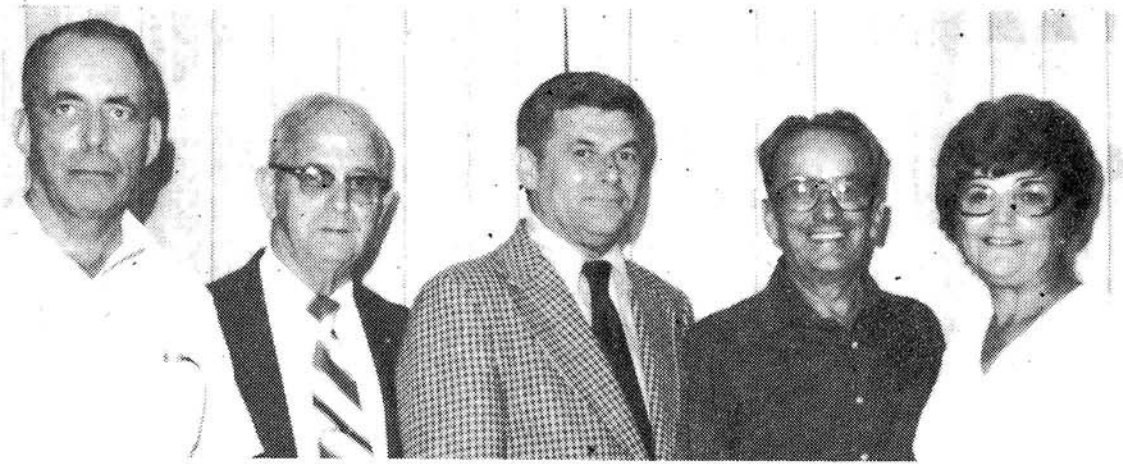
