



Men who wrote or provided art work for the wartime Deadeye Dispatch will be furnishing items, articles and art work for the book. Besides those persons and others, the women who were active in the formation of the auxiliary and who have firsthand knowledge of that group's activities will be mainly involved with preparation of Book II, Ladies Auxiliary: A Family Affair.

"We need to have a lot of cooperation from everybody if this book is to tell the whole story. It will be both a story book and a reference book," says Dakan. "We expect YOURS IN COMRADESHIP to interest anyone who has attended even one of our reunions. The book ought to pretty well sum up to date the postwar activities of the men of the 96th."

The date of July 26, 1984, subscription deadline, will be all important to this project. A long selling campaign and follow-up to plead for more participation is not being anticipated. Now is the time to do it or drop it.
