

They left behind wives and children, some of which never got to know their fathers and only have pictures to know what he looked like. But some of us survived, and each year as we gather at the reunions, the thoughts and prayers go back to those who did not. Those of us who came home, have regained our places in our home towns, in the business world, and with our families. Some, because of illness or accidents, have passed on -- but we did return. There are some that had a great warm feeling for those who died in battle. That made them want to return to the places where those buddies died. Each year for the past 8 or 10 years some have returned to the Philippines to help them celebrate their gift of freedom. The black moved as he arose.




