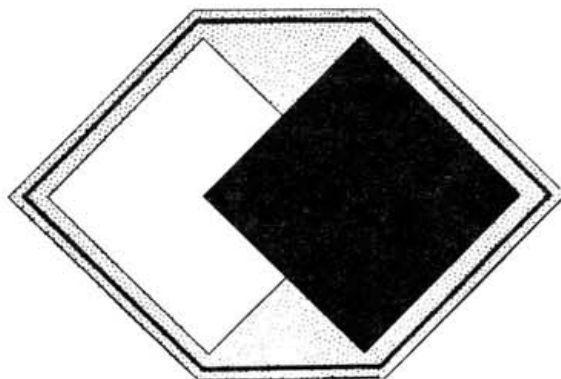

Clarence Craft reunited with WW II citation in 1985

The historians who wrote The DEAD-EYES, The Story of the 96th Infantry Division described Pfc. Clarence B. Craft's (G-382) feats on Hen Hill as "... the greatest individual exploit of the Okinawa campaign". His grim way for carrying the fight to the enemy was told in several paragraphs on pages 161 and 163 with page 162 taken up by a full-color illustration. This action won him the Medal of Honor.

Craft survived the war and returned to Santa Ana, Calif., then moved on to Fayetteville, Ark. At the time of his move to Arkansas, the Medal of Honor citation signed by President Harry S. Truman was left with a V.F.W. post in California. When Craft went back to retrieve the citation, it had disappeared.

One night about 10 years ago, Jim Wornski, owner of a janitorial business in Orange, Calif., was cleaning a recruiting office. He found Craft's citation in the trash.

Wornski and his wife, Linda, began a search for Craft by calling all Crafts in the area, but somehow missed Craft's brother, Louis, who lives in Garden Grove.

The search was rekindled in May 1985 when a friend of the Wornskis attended a Memorial Day service in Orange County and Craft was mentioned as a local hero. Wornski called the Orange County Register newspaper. Within a few hours and after a half-dozen more telephone calls, a reporter found Clarence Craft weeding his tomato garden in Arkansas. The story was spread by AP and UPI in newspapers across the country.

"It kind of blew my mind," Wornski said. "I never thought we would find him alive."

"I told him I was happy he located the citation. I'd like to have it," said Craft, surprised to hear from Wornski.

And Craft got back the citation by mail.

Since Clarence Craft's address in Fayetteville, Ark., was not recorded in current DEADEYE files, Norman Schram (H-382), who lives in nearby Rogers, Ark., made a point of inviting Craft to a reunion of 81mm mortarmen in 1985. Again, in the fall of 1986, Norman contacted Clarence at the V.A. Hospital in Fayetteville where he is a volunteer twice a week helping new patients find their way around and pushing wheelchairs.

Be sure to send in your reservations early so that you be assured of a room in the Reunion Hotel.

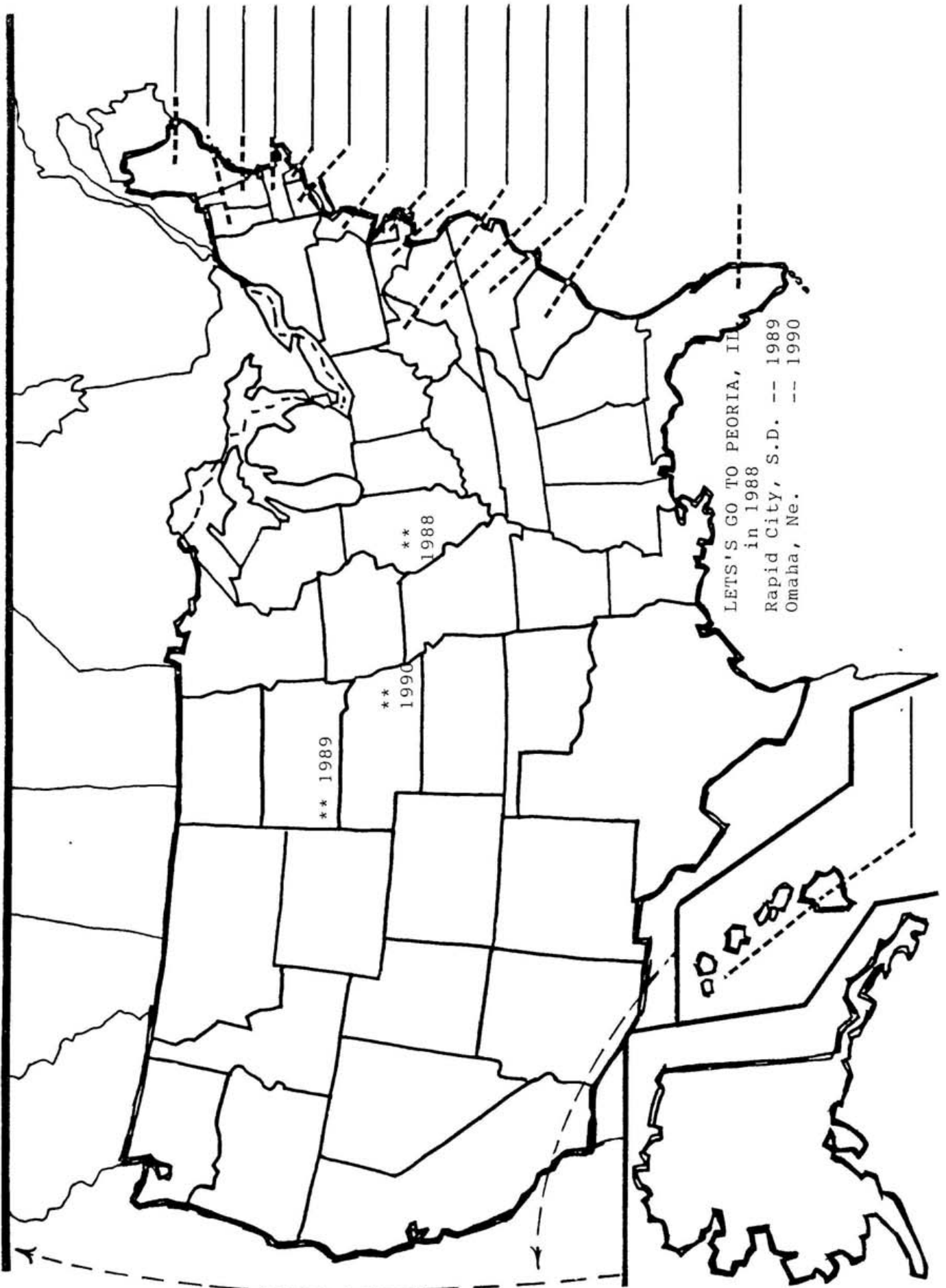
