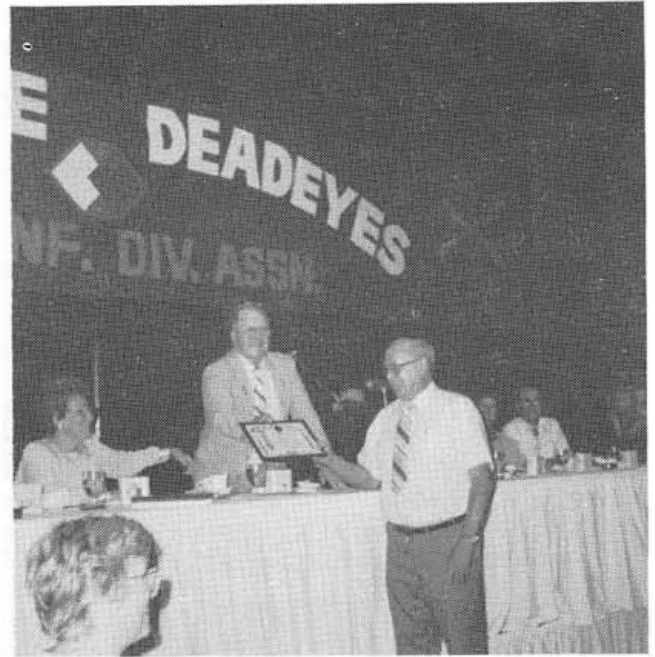

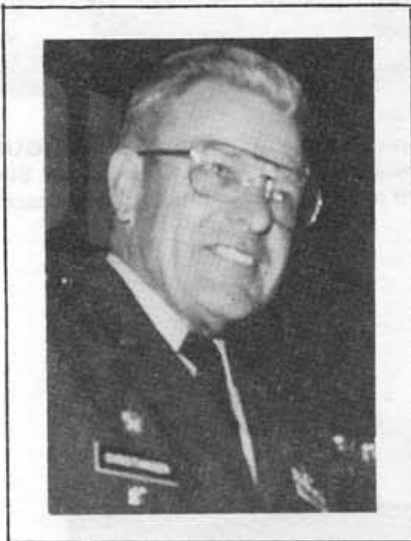
These Deadeyes were enjoying a relaxing moment outside the Continental Regency Hotel in Peoria, Illinois.

Something of a relationship has developed between the old 96th Infantry Division and its namesake, the 96th ARCOM.

Association presidents Anthony Pavell (1986-1987) and Donald Foster (1987-1988), each on his own, went to Salt Lake City, Utah, to be honored guests of the 96th ARCOM at their annual three-day conference. From now on, the revised bylaws of the Association will cause the treasurer to provide a cash allowance to the president in order that he may participate.

Reciprocally, Maj. Gen. Richard O. Christiansen, Commanding General, 96th ARCOM, attended the reunion in Peoria. The following is a transcript of his remarks at the joint meeting on July 29.

## The 96th ARCOM Connection



Maj. Gen. Richard O. Christiansen

I remember fondly the experience I had with you in Oklahoma City telling you a little bit about the 96th Infantry Division's child. Let me tell you that the 96th is alive and well and over 10,000 citizen-soldiers (we call them weekend soldiers) are wearing the patch. They are Reservists in the United States Army.

Two years ago Tony Pavell was present at our March banquet in Salt Lake City and then this past March both Don and Donna Foster were with us.

We are delighted to be able to continue to maintain this link between the old and new, or the older and new. I do this deliberately for my young soldiers. We have people in our units who are 17 years

of age that have not the slightest idea what it means to perform a personal sacrifice of any type. Most of them don't know how to work. I know my 17-year old has not learned what it means to get down into a trench and dig and work until the sweat comes on his brow.

But these young soldiers need a link to tie them to the past. This is what I have been trying to do by maintaining a relationship with your Association of the 96th Division and relaying to them some of the experiences that you have gone through.

This past spring at our annual conference and banquet, our speaker was Col. Bernie Fisher, a Medal of Honor winner from the Vietnam War in 1965. He was successful in rescuing a downed pilot - brought him out in an aircraft that was shot completely full of holes. Along with Fisher, we honored another Medal of Honor winner, George Wahlen from Utah. He was on Iwo Jima with the Marines.

Next March, as our speaker, we are having a member of your Division who wears the Medal of Honor. Two or three months ago I made a special trip to Hunter Liggett, California. I met Sgt. "Snuffy" Anderson for breakfast at the officers club there at Hunter Liggett for the express purpose to gain his guarantee that he will represent the old 96th Division at our big affair in Salt Lake City this coming March. He committed himself to do that.

When I told him that I was coming here, he said, "Tell them that I am just as ornery and outspoken as ever." I told my boss who

is a three-star general in the active Army about going to Hunter Liggett to meet with Sergeant Anderson - he actually retired as a second lieutenant after the war. He said, "Oh, "Snuffy" Anderson! I know that guy. He owns a ranch just outside of Hunter Liggett."

Apparently "Snuffy" owned this ranch on the border of Hunter Liggett, which is a small mountaintop firing range and Army post. It is used by the Seventh Division out of Ft. Ord and by other troops. "Snuffy" kept complaining to the camp commander about all of the noise and so on and so forth.

I told "Snuffy" about this during breakfast, laughingly. He said, "Well, they won't have to worry about that anymore. I sold my ranch at a handsome profit and built a quarter-million dollar home in Salinas, California." So he is now a few miles from Hunter Liggett.

"Snuffy" suffers greatly from emphysema, but he promised that if I would send somebody to act as his aide and carry his bags, he will be there.

The 96th Army Reserve Command, and that is where the term ARCOM comes from, includes the 321st Engineer Battalion. Bravo Company - you called it Baker Company - is in Hayden Lake up near Coeur d'Alene, Idaho. Delta Company, I guess you called it Dog Company, is in Twin Falls Idaho, and Charlie Company is in Ogden, Utah. I believe that is the only organization that we have with us today that was a member of the old 96th Infantry Division.

In the United States Army Reserve and the National Guard, today, reside over 53 percent of the forces that would be required by our country if we were to go to war. Your active Army is the smallest it has been in over 40 years. There are 758,000 people in the active army, considerably down from over 10 million men that were in during your day.

Because of its present small size, the active Army will rely heavily on Reserve components - the Army Reserve and National Guard - as I have indicated. These are the contingency forces that would be required if we were to be mobilized.

What we used to call summer camp - now we call it annual training - that two or three week training can take place any time during the year. This current year, by the time September rolls around, we will have had 23 units training outside of our contiguous United States. An entire engineer battalion from Colorado has spent the summer in Anchorage, Alaska, with the Sixth

Infantry Division. An Infantry Battalion out of Colorado Springs has just returned from the Jungle Operations Training Center in Panama.

That is part of our wartime mission. If we are mobilized and go to war, that infantry battalion will go to Panama, so what better place for them to train for a two or three week period than in the same area to which they will go for a wartime assignment. And it goes on and on.

The Reserve today is much different from what you would have anticipated it being just a few years ago. Over 90 percent of your country's Army ammunition resupply capability is in the Reserve component. Over 75 percent of your combat engineer capability is in the Reserve component. Over 80 percent of the hospital bed capability is in the Reserve. Strictly put, if your country goes to war tomorrow or today, the Reserve is going to go with it. That is our charge. That is our requirement and that is why I go on the road about 49 or 50 weekends a year.

But with all of this travel, when I unpacked last night, I had forgotten my shaving kit. Well, I guess I forgot to look at my checklist.

I wear the uniform about 221 days a year as a Reservist. Thanks to the president of the University of Utah who allows me to do that while holding down a full-time job in his employ in Salt Lake City. And that is the case with many of our Reservists who are dedicated and devoted. They wear your patch and carry and display your flag. We hope that we can maintain the tradition that you great people have set for us in the years past.

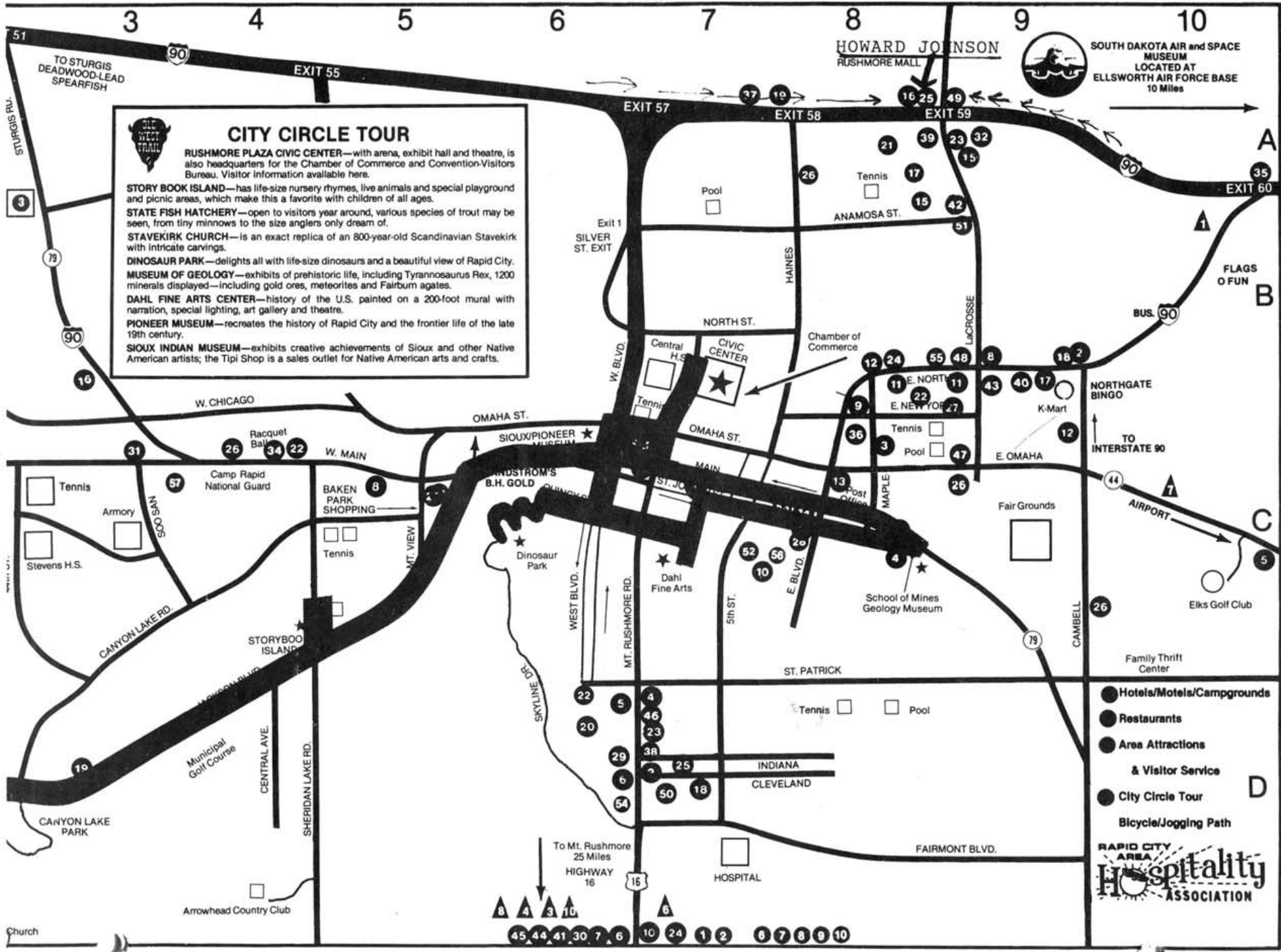
**DAHL FINE ARTS CENTER**—history of the U.S. painted on a 200-foot mural with narration, special lighting, art gallery and theatre.
