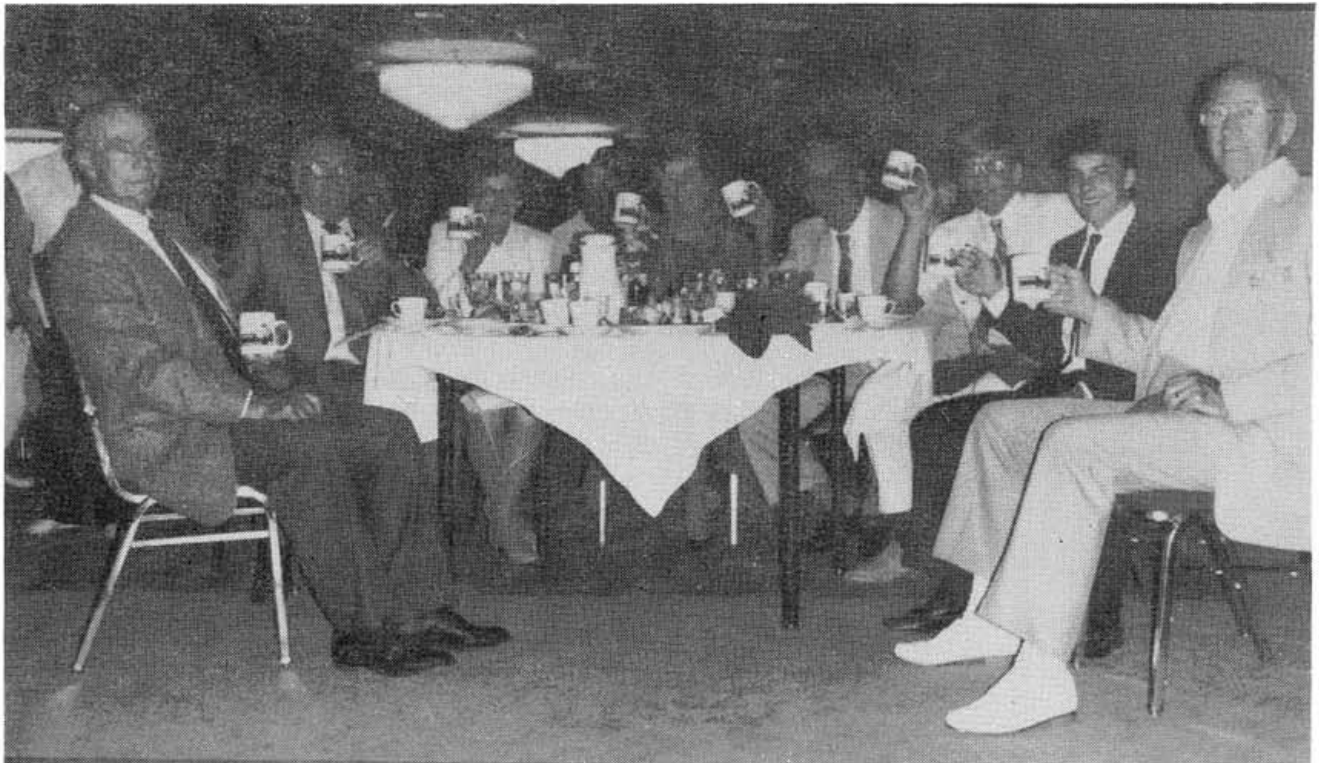

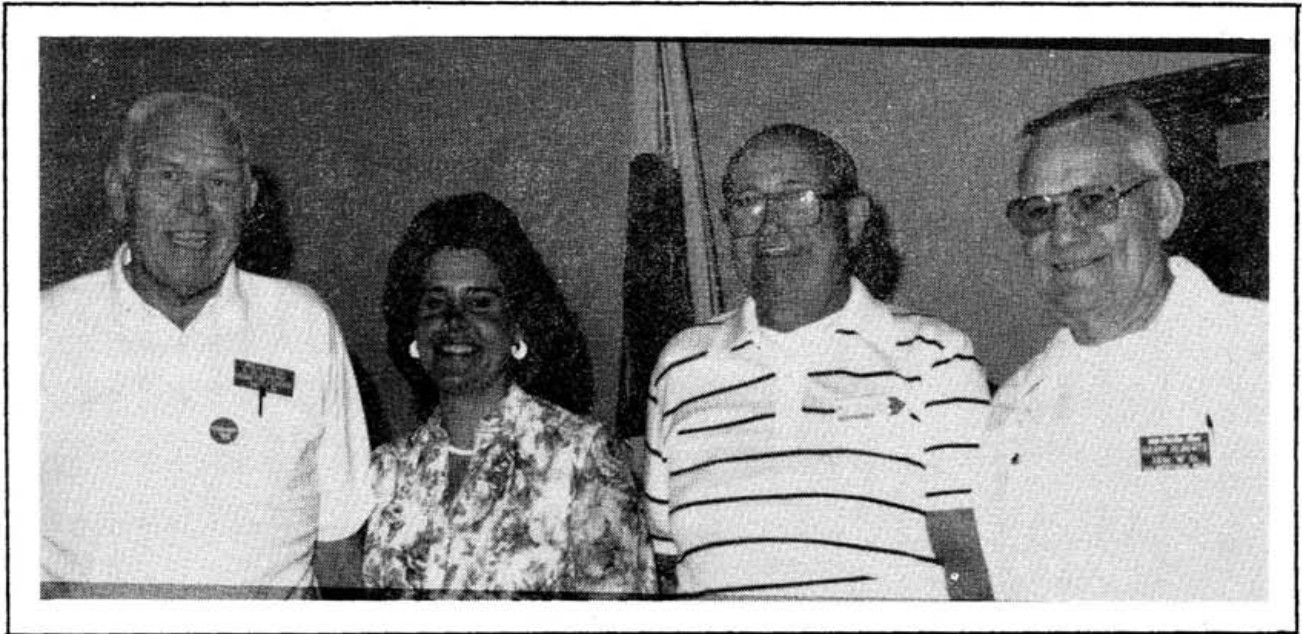

Taps sounded and the colors were retired smartly. And in a heavy silence, the DEADEYES remembered.
