

CITATION

As authorized by Executive Order 9396, (Sec 1, WD Bul. 22, 1943), superseding Executive Order 9075 (Sec III WD Bul. II, 1942), the following unit is cited under the provisions of Sec IV, WD Circular 333, 1943, in the name of the President of the United States as public evidence of deserved honor and distinction.

These units distinguished themselves in combat, during the period 1 April 1945 to 30 June 1945, by extraordinary heroism and gallantry in action against the enemy in the conquest of OKINAWA, RYUKYU ISLANDS, JAPAN. On 1 April 1945 the 96th Division made an assault landing on the Hagushi beaches of Okinawa and within three days overcame all resistance in the large Sunabe hill mass which dominated the XXIV Corps' landing beaches. The division then immediately attacked rapidly and skillfully south down the western half of the island, overrunning and destroying or driving in enemy outpost lines and strongpoints guarding the approaches to the main Japanese defense hub at Shuri. By 7 April, the division had penetrated the main outer ring. On 9 April the division initiated a series of attacks against the powerful Japanese defense position at Kakazu Ridge. It was necessary to dig. blast and burn or bury forever the fanatical Japanese defenders. The enemy were destroyed in their holes one by one. By 15 April, the division had gained control of cominant portions of the ridge. On 16 April, the division became an interior division when a third division entered the lines on its right flank. It continued its day after day assaults. Tombstone Hill was seized. Tanabaru and Maeda escarpments were captured. Needle Rock Hill 153 and The Gate were all taken. On I May, the division was withdrawn for nine days' rest and for reception and assimila-tion of replacements totalling over 4,000. On 9 May, the division reentered the lines on the left (east) flank, and began a series of bitter, bloody, hand-to-hand assaults designed to wrest from the Japanese Conical Hill, the vital key to the eastern section of the Shuri battle position. The desperate defenders struck back with all the fire and manpower at their command. Concentrations of artillery and medium and heavy (320 mm) mortar fire were placed upon our lines in densities and durations previously unknown in the Pacific War. By 21 May, the crest and eastern slopes of Conical Hill had been captured, opening an envelopment route to turn Shuri, and frantic and powerful enemy thrusts to regain it were beaten off in fighting of ghastly fury. To the west of Conical Hill, the division captured Sugar Hill and broke through the Shuri line to within 200 yards of the Nahi-Shuri-Yonabaru Road, the enemy's innermost and essential communcation line. Loss of Conical Hill doomed the Shuri Position, and the enemy started withdrawal, shortly after its fall, to final positions along the south tip of the island. The division, after mopping up, bypassed infiltrating enemy groups and continued its pursuit of the retreating Japanese. On the final Jap positions on the Yuza-Yaeju-Dake escarpments, the two highest hills were in the zone of the 96th Division. The division assaulted them heroically and with fury which could not be stopped, using the same hand-to-hand, digging, blasting, burning assaults required in earlier engagements. The 96th Division ended its portion of the organized fighting as it began it, constantly closing to bayonet range with a gallantry, heroism and determination to win which carried its attacks forward despite terrible and crippling casualties and physical discomforts almost beyond human endurance. It killed a total of 37,763 of the enemy in 73 days of fighting. Its own battle losses totalled 7,294, including 1,504 killed. The brilliant victories achieved by the 96th Division on Okinawa contributed greatly to the defeat of the large enemy garrison. The esprit, heroism and continuing demonstrations of raw courage throughout the battle exemplified the highest traditions of the military service.

But when this old life is over And we will work no more, And we will do our last dress parade In front of so called "General May".


On that day we'll see St.Peter He will take one look then yell, "Come on you boys from the 96th You've spent your time in hell."



A PONCHO FOR HIS SHROUD

"Bucky" Amelung (C-382) had a too close call with the grave diggers on Okinawa. The snafu that happened nearly a half-century ago got him counted as dead for a while. Even to-day, as far as he knows, somewhere out there in a military cemetery is supposed to be a grave with his name on it.

Bucky showed up at the reunion in Hot Springs, Arkansas, live and in color.

Back in 1945. The Army did not want to believe Bucky had been resurrected. They had one
of his dog tags to show; the other one was presumed to have been wedged in his mouth after he
expired. He was redlined on the payroll and his
wife's allotment was stopped. His next of kin
received a certificate, suitable for framing,
bearing the official seal of the United States
of America also the signature of President
Roosevelt: In grateful memory of Pvt, Alva J,
Amelung who died in the service of his country
in the Pacific Area, April 10, 1945.

kemember this infamous day and year for those terribly vicious clashes everywhere along the battle line. Only afterwards did Bucky find out more of the big picture and his little bitty part in it.

The enemy installations on Tombstone Ridge dominated the ground across the entire 382d Regimental front. That rainy day had gone badly for the 1st Battalion in particular. At the start Company A had siezed the northern nose of Tombstone Ridge, but it was stopped by smallarms fire from the steep slopes of the ridge and heavy artillery and mortar fire. When Companies B and C awang west to assault by a different route, a concentration of mortar and artillery fire caught them at the creat.

Rifleman Amelung crouched behind a pile of rocks while Company C mortarmen worked to quiet down the Japanese. Artillery shells bracketed his scant cover, then a third shell he never knew anything about exploded. The rock pile that may have been used for an aiming point was knocked down on top of him. His lights went out.

Not clear are the circumstances of Bucky's evacuation from Tombstone Ridge and the medical aid he was given or how he happened to be declared dead. But frozen in time forever in his memory are some moments after consciousness came back the next morning with the sound of a motor running - like an earthmover.

"I seemed to be wrapped up pretty tight in a poncho. I got one eye open. A hole in the poncho let in some daylight, though I couldn't



see What was going on. One arm and one Leg was free.

"What about the dog tag I spit out?

"My strength was about used up by the pushing and kicking to start a rip in the poncho, but I got my leg up in the air. Pretty soon a guy on the detail that was digging graves with the bulldozer saw me and trotted over to where I was lying down on a litter bare assed naked except for some gauze patches."

"You're not dead?"

"No."

FOLLOW-UP

The work detail at the cemetery carried Amelung away from his place amongst the collection of stiffs. A medic transfused 44 pints of fluid. Wearing pajamas, he was put aboard a C-47 bound for Guam.

Bucky's most serious damage - head, neck, back and right hand - was sewed up during six days on Guam. While there, a Salvation Army gal wrote a letter for him. Fortunately for the folks in Ohio, that letter arrived before the telegram telling about his death.

Ambulatory, he was transferred by C-54 hospital plane to the 147th General Hospital near Honolulu. Many Company C men who were also recouperating there did double takes. The consensus: "You're dead."

Fifteen cables were necessary to convince the War Department that Alva J. Amelung still lived.

Bucky had been out of the Army for two or three months before he received back pay. His wife's allotment was finally paid in full. E.E. Dakan

Navy is now hard at work on site and foundation work for the restoration of the Brig. General Claudius Easley and Col. Edwin May monuments at the General Buckner battlefield site in Southern Okinawa. The Seabees are generously donating engineering design, construction equipment, supervision and labor to this effort. The Seabees are ably led by Chief Petty Officer Cory Hines, Site Work Manager; Chief George Kohn, Planning; and Commander Robert Phillips Commanding Officer. John Ensor of Oakton, Va. was at the Reunion in Sparks, Nv. Alex Kishaba represented the Ryukyu-American Historical Research Society and asked the Veterans to return wartime souvenirs — items that could be cultural artifacts or of priceless value to surviving families.

Ensor hesitantly approached him, telling of the flag found in the Philippines, not Okinawa. Kishaba accepted it and, through careful research, found the Ikeda family, Shinjun Oshiro, a former parliamentarian, represented Kishaba and handed Kiyomasa Ikeda his brother's flag.


For a moment, Kiyomasa Ikeda was stolid and composed, a Japanese taught as a child that subtiety and self-containment was the way and displays of emotion were unmannerly.

Then an old battle flag, lost for 50 years, touched his hands. He pressed it to his face like a widow's handerchief and wept.

"Welcome home, my brother, after all these years.

Recovering after his tearful outburst, Kiyomasa asked and American bystander: "Please tell Ensor-san I am grateful."


