

HOTEL LOCATION

Little America Hotel & Towers is located in the heart of downtown Salt Lake City at 500 South Main Street, Salt Lake City, UT 84101. -From Interstate 80 eastbound, go past the International Airport; take Interstate 15 South for less than one mile; then take Exit 121 and follow directions above.

-From Interstate 80 westbound, take Interstate 15 North; travel about 4 miles and take Exit 121. Follow directions above.

HOTEL EXTRAS



Or stop and shake my hand.







Dear Mrs. Strand:

Last October my wife and I were able to visit Leyte, and to attend the local celebrations of Philippine Liberation Day on October 19th and October 20th. I thought our experience might be of interest of the readers of the Dispatch.

On October 18th we stopped at the memorial park in Dulag, and by happenstance met with the governor's assistant who was there in the park. When finding that I had been part of the 96th Division and part of the original landing forces on October 20, 1944, she asked me if I would attend the Dulag ceremonies on the following day at Hill 120 and would speak to the gathering. The following morning we went to the park at the base of Hill 120, where we were part of a crowd of about 2000 people. The honored guests were the governor of Leyte, the mayor of Dulag, the director of tourism, and a group of local veterans, who had worked with the landing forces in 1944. We were somewhat overwhelmed by the crowd, by the enthusiasm of the local people, and the warmth with which they received us. We did not plan it, but as circumstances would have it, I was the only veteran of the original invasion on the island during this 54th Anniversary of our landings. My wife and I were greeted so warmly and there was an outpouring of gratitude to America for the liberation of the island and of the Philippines. It was an honor to represent the 96th Division..

In my remarks, I told them something of what happened to the 96th Division during the campaign on Leyte and later on Okinawa. I shared with them especially, what happened to Company I, 383rd Infantry during the remainder of the war. On behalf of the 96th Division I directed our thanks to the assembled Philippine Veterans for their assistance during our landings and thereafter. When I concluded my remarks, I went to the group of veterans to personally greet them and thank them, and there were tears shed by all. They were and are a wonderful, friendly people.

Following the Dulag ceremony, we were guests of the governor and mayor at a luncheon, and we were invited to the celebration at McArthur Park the following day. This park is on the northern landing beaches close to Tacloban, and is the point where MacArthur made is famous return to the Philippines, where he and his landing party are now memorialized in larger than life statues. The assembled crowd was in the thousands and even 54 years later, this is a huge celebration and holiday for the people of Leyte.

Again, I was identified as the only veteran of the actual landing forces, and as such I was asked to raise the American flag and to place a wreath at their tomb of the unknown soldier. It was an occasion and an honor which I will never forget to be able to represent the 96th Division and all of the American forces at this ceremony.

My wife and I later went to Okinawa and visited the landing beaches and battle sites. Again tears were shed in the Memorial Cemetery, which includes American and Japanese dead. It is a trip and memories which I will carry for the rest of my life.


