CIB Holders Can Ask for **Bronze Star**

ALEXANDRIA, Va. - Veterans, retirees and active duty soldiers who received the Combat Infantry Badge or Combat Medical Badge during World War II can apply for the Bronze Star Medal.

While that may be good news for thousands of people, it has caused a minor flap and huge influx of mail into the awards branch of the Military Personnel Center.

In its September issue, a national veterans magazine correctly reported the new policy, but cited MilPerCen — which handles only active duty awards - as the agency responsible for processing applications.

Vets who received the CIB or CMB during WW II and who would like to apply for the Bronze Star should send their requests to the Center Manager, National Personnel Records Center, St. Louis, Mo.

Military retirees who qualify for the award should send their applications to the Awards Branch, Reserve Components Personnel and Administration Center, St. Louis, Mo. 63132.



VETERANS OF WORLD WAR II 35th ANNIVERSARY TOUR OCTOBER 14, 1979

OCTOBER 24 MANILA

Morning CORREGIDOR ISLAND TOUR via Hovercraft. This is the historic little island that guards the entrance to Manila Bay. For four months during World War II, this fortress held the enemy at bay and gained precious time for the Allies to recoup after suffering a succession of defeats. Malinta Tunnel, MacArthur's headquarters; Battery Way; the Pacific War Memorial are some of the highlights not to be missed.

Afternoon MANILA CITY TOUR, visiting Intramuros (The Walled City) with its San Augustine Church, the oldest stone church in the Philippines; historic but grim Fort Santiago; Commercial Districts and Malacanang Palace. Tour includes the suburban town of Makati, the country's richest town; Forbes Park, known as "Millionaires' Row"; and the Manila American Cemetary and Memorial, the largest and most beautiful American Memorial outside the continental United States.
