




I see you at the meetings



On January 10, 1946, Headquarter Army Ground Forces General Jacob L. Devers, submitted to the Chief of Staff, W.S. Army a report which included a list of the casualty figures by divisions.

For me it was an eye-opener. We all knew that we took heavy casualties, particularly on Okinawa, but if you are like me, you may have thought that perhaps your perspective was somewhat limited and your opinion a little biased. The figures in this report indicate that our gut feelings were right. Ranking the divisions by total casualties, the 96th came up 10th for the entire Army and first in the Pacific.

It indicated that the 96th had a total of 16,834 casualties. At the time of Okinawa landings, the T.O. called for a complement of 14,037 for an infantry division. It was 14,253 at the time of the invasion of Leyte. You may recall that at no time during the war was the division up to full strength. We sailed for Okinawa appoximately 1,000 men short of our T.O. strength and most of this shortage was in the infantry units. This would indicate that our actual overall casualty rate for both battles combined was about 119%

Newspaper articles which commented on the report, shortly after its release, said that it proved that MacArthur's tactics of bypassing Japanese strongpoints such as Rabul and points along the north coast of New Guinea, actually saved lives. I recall, that many G.I.s, including myself, had little love for MacArthur. If the media analysis is correct, then perhaps we owe him a belated "thank you." The article mentioned that some units in the Pacific shifted between MacArthur's South West Pacific Command and the Navy's Central Pacific Command. the 96th was mentioned as a specific case in point. It mentioned that the 32nd and 41st Division served in the Pacific exclusively under MacArthur almost from the start but suffered lower casulties - 14,124 and 5,634 respectively. The implication being that, had we remained with MacArthur, we might have had fewer casualties.

Those who viewed the ETO as the only real combat theater, have suggested that the list, which 9 of the 10 hardest hit divisions in the ETO, proved that the Germans were a more formidable enemy. Those who analysed the report, debunked that theory, pointing to the casualties sustained by the Marines against the common enemy in the Pacific. All the Marine units which took the Japs head-on, as we did on Okinawa, sustained heavy casualties. Incidently, although most Marine divisions saw action in the Pacific before the 96th, only the 1st Marine Division, sustained heavier casualties - another indicator that the 96th, a relative new comer in the Pacific, saw more than it's share of heavy fighting.

The Marine divisions were larger than their Army counterparts. In addition, while the Army divisions went to Okinawa approximately 10% under T.O. strength, the Marines went in 10% over-strength. Since we had to compete with the ETO for infantry replacements and it had first priority in the war effort, we went ashore short-handed and with additional casualty replacements, nowhere in sight.

On Okinawa, the 6th Marine Division actually had more casualties than several of the Army divisions, despite the fact that they saw little action in April. Considering they went ashore with more men than their Army counterparts, they actually suffered lower casualty rates over-all.

I wish to thank Donald Dencker -- 382-L for sharing this information with me and for allowing me to pass it on to our fellow "Deadeyes." See you all in Sparks in July, 1993. Bring lots of recreation money. It's the only thing that keeps arid Nevada "green".




